

SYLLABUS FOR MEDICAL OFFICER(AYURVEDA)

(I) The examination will comprise of:

(a) **Written examination:** The candidates will take the examination in the following two papers each of two hours duration each carrying a maximum of 200 marks. The questions in both the papers will be so designed as to give the following weightage to different subjects.

Paper-I(CODE NO.1): 200 Marks

(i) Kayachititsā-I,II,III,IV.

(Practice of medicine in ayurveda)

Weightage
60%(120 marks)

(ii) shalya(Surgery) including shalakya

(E.N.T. Ophthalmology, Dental) with Ayurvedic therapeutics

40%(80 marks)

Paper-II(Code no.2): 200 marks

(i) kaumarbrittya(Pedoatros)

10%(20 marks)

(ii) Stree rogas and prasuitantra

(Gynecology and Obsterics) with ayurvedic therapeutics

30%(60 marks)

(iii) Swasthavritta(Preventive, Social and Community medicine)

10%(20 marks)

(iv) Draya Guna and Rasashastra(Ayurvedic Pharmacology)

20%(40 marks)

(v) Organon of medicine and philosophy,

(Padartha Vigyan and Astanga Sangraha)

30%(60 marks)

(b) Viva-voce: 50 marks

(i) Personality test and General aptitude

10%(10 marks)

(ii) General medical subjects for MO(Allopathy)

40%(40 marks)

(II) The examination in both the papers will be completely of objective (multiple choice answer) type. The question papers(test booklets) will be set in English only.

(III) Candidates must write the papers in their own hand. In no circumstances will they be allowed the help of scribe to write answers for them.

(IV) Candidates are not permitted to use calculators for answering objective type paper(test booklets). They should not, therefore, bring the same inside the examination hall.

(V) Selection on the basis of maximum marks in written and viva-voce.

(VI) No negative marking/ minimum qualifying marks.
