- (a) Is Dorothea's life a failure? What constitutes failure in the world of the novel, Middlemarch?
- (b) "The Mayor of Casterbridge presents Hardy's view of life." Does this statement hold true? Justify your answer.
- (c) How does the idea of constancy of emotion and love figure in the novel? Illuminate David's character in Dicken's David Copperfield.
- (d) "Satan is the well-developed character in *Paradise Lost*." Is he a sympathetic character? Identify the character traits that make him seem appealing or forgivable.
- (e) Name some of the father-son relationships in the play, Henry IV (Part 2). Discuss how those relationships change as the play progresses.
- (f) Comment on the theme of rebirth from your reading of Eliot's The Waste Land.
- (g) Discuss how *The Prelude* portrays the development of the poet's mind by emphasizing a mutual consciousness and spiritual communion between the world of nature and man.
