No.PERS-24/2018.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India and in supersession of the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Combined Competitive Examination Rules, 2001 (notified vide No. Pers 30/97 dated 9th February, 2001), except as things done or omitted to be done before such supersession, the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh hereby makes the following Rules to regulate the method of recruitment to the services specified in Schedule-I.

1. **Short title and commencement :** (1) These rules may be called "**the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Combined Competitive Examination (APPSCCE) Rules, 2019**".
(2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Gazette of Arunachal Pradesh.
2. **Definition :** In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant to the subject or context :
 - (a) Combined Competitive Examination means the Examination conducted by the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission for recruitment to the services and posts mentioned in Schedule-I and includes both the Preliminary Examination and the Main Examination.
 - (b) 'Commission' means the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) 'Government' means the Government of Arunachal Pradesh;
 - (d) 'Governor' means the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh;
 - (e) 'Main Examination' means the second stage of examination both written and viva-voce conducted by the Commission for selection of candidates for appointment to the services specified in the Schedule-I;
 - (f) 'Preliminary Examination' means the first stage of examination conducted by the Commission for screening candidates for the Main Examination;
 - (g) 'Services' means the services and posts under the Government specified in Schedule-I;
 - (h) 'Year' means the calendar year.
3. **Combined competitive examination :**
 - (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Arunachal Pradesh Civil Service Rules, 2019 the Arunachal Pradesh Police Service Rules, 1989, the Arunachal Pradesh Labour service Rules, 1991 or any other Service Rules relating to services and posts mentioned in Schedule-I, the Commission shall hold combined Competitive Examination every year for selection of candidate for recruitment to the services in accordance with procedure laid down in Schedule-II.
 - (2) The Commission shall, after the main examination, prepare a merit list of candidates and recommend and forward such list to the Government for appointment to different services under the respective Service Rules.
4. **Procedure for holding Combined Competitive Examination under the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Combined Competitive Examination Rules, 2019 :**
 - (1) The Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission shall hold the Combined Competitive Examination in two stages, namely Preliminary Examination and Main Examination in accordance with the rules and procedures prescribed herein in respect of the services as mentioned in Schedule-I.
 - (2) The examination shall be conducted by the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission in the manner and with the Syllabus as prescribed in Schedule-II.
 - (3) The dates on which and the places at which the preliminary and the Main Examination will be held, shall be fixed by the Commission.
 - (4) A candidate shall be required to indicate in the application form for the Main Examination, his/her order of preference for various Services/Posts for which he/she would like to be considered for appointment in case he/she is recommended for appointment by Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission.

5. Eligibility Criteria :

- (i) For these services and posts for which the combined Competitive Examination is held a candidate must be Citizen of India.
 - (ii) A candidate shall not be less than 21 years and not more than 32 years of age as on the last date of receipt of application as advertised or published by Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission.
 - (iii) The upper age limit prescribed above will be relaxable,
 - (a) Upto a maximum of five years, if a candidate belongs to Arunachal Pradesh Scheduled Tribe.
 - (b) Upto a maximum of three years in case of defence service personnel, disabled in operation during hostility with a foreign country or in disturbed area and released as a consequence thereof.
 - (c) Upto a maximum of 8 years in case of defense service personnel, belonging to APST disabled in operation during hostility with any foreign country or disturbed area and released as a consequence thereof.
 - (d) Up to a maximum of 10 years of age in respect of candidates belonging to PwD Category (15 years for APST PwD candidate).
 - (iv) Age concession in respect of Government servants will be as per Government rules and regulations in force from time to time.
 - (v) The date of birth accepted by the Commission shall be that which is entered in Matriculation/ High School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate or a Certificate recognized by an Indian University as equivalent to Matriculation or an extract from a register of Matriculates maintained by a University, which extract must be certified by the competent authority of the University or in the Higher Secondary or an equivalent examination certificate.
(NOTE:- THESE CERTIFICATES ARE REQUIRED TO BE SUBMITTED AT THE TIME OF SUBMITTING APPLICATION FOR THE COMBINED COMPETITIVE MAIN EXAMINATION ONLY.)
 - (vi) No other document relating to age like horoscopes, affidavits, birth extracts from Municipal Corporation, Registrar Economics and Statistics and Service Records shall be accepted.
6. A candidate must hold a degree from any of the UGC recognized Universities incorporated by an Act of the Central or State Legislature in India or other educational Institution established by an Act of Parliament or declared to be deemed as a University under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 or possess such qualification as may be declared equivalent by the Government.
7. Candidate must pay the fees as notified by the Commission.
8. All candidates in Government service whether in a permanent or temporary capacity or as work charged employees, other than casual or daily rated employees or those serving, under Public Enterprises/Bank and other such bodies shall be required to state in the appropriate space of the application that they have informed in writing to their employer/Controlling authority that they have applied to sit for the examination. Candidates should note that in-case communication is received from their employer/Controlling authority by the Commission withholding permission to the candidate applying for appearing at the examination their applications shall be rejected and their candidature shall be cancelled.
9. The decision of the Commission as to the eligibility or otherwise of a candidate for admission to the examination shall be final and binding.
10. No candidate shall be admitted to the Preliminary/Main Examination unless he holds a certificate of Admission from the Commission for that purpose.
11. A candidate who is or has been declared by the Commission to be guilty of-
- (a) Obtaining support for his/her candidature by any unfair means or,
 - (b) Impersonation, or
 - (c) Procuring impersonation by any person, or
 - (d) Submitted fabricated documents or documents which have been tampered with or
 - (e) Making false or incorrect statement or suppressing material fact or information or
 - (f) Resorting to any other irregular or improper means in connection with his/her candidature for the examination or

- (g) Using unfair means during the examination or
- (h) Writing irrelevant matter, including obscene language or pornographic matter in the scripts or
- (i) Misbehaving in any other manner in the Examination Hall, or
- (j) Harassing or doing bodily harm to the Supervisory Officer/Invigilators/Staff employed by the Commission for the conduct of examination or
- (k) Violating any of the instructions issued to the candidate along with their Admission Certificate/ Call letter permitting them to take the examination, or commission or as the case may be attempting the commission of all or any of the acts specified in the foregoing clauses by a candidate may, in addition to rendering him liable to criminal prosecution be liable,-
- (a) to be disqualified by the Commission from the Examination for which he/she is a candidate, or
- (b) to be debarred permanently or for a specified period.
- (i) by the Commission from any examination or selection held by them.
- (ii) by the State Government from any employment under them, and
- (c) If he/she is already in service under the Government, disciplinary action under the relevant Rules shall be instituted.
- (d) Provided that no penalty under this rule shall be imposed except after:
- (i) giving the candidate an opportunity of making such representation in writing as he wishes to make in that behalf, and
- (ii) taking the representation if any, submitted by the candidate within the period allowed to him into consideration.
- (iii) Provided further that if any candidate found to have been debarred by any other Commission the candidate shall stand so debarred for the purpose of this Commission.
12. (1) Candidates who obtain such minimum qualifying marks in the Preliminary Examination as may be fixed by the Commission at their discretion shall be admitted to the Main Examination, and candidates who obtain such minimum marks in the Main (written) Examination as may be fixed by the Commission at their discretion shall be called for an interview for personality and other tests. However, such cutoff marks shall not be less than the minimum standard prescribed in the Government of Arunachal Pradesh OM No. 54/2006 dated 7th January, 2008.
- (2) The Commission shall decide cutoff marks based on several factors like total number of vacancies, total number of candidates in each stage, level of difficulties, reservation norms based on various categories, marking allotment scheme and last year cutoff trends. The Commission shall devise methodology for determining cutoff marks at their level and it shall be published in their website.
- (3) It is further provided that the candidates applying for the pcst of Arunachal Pradesh Police Service and called for the interview shall have to conform to the physical standard prescribed in Appendix-II.
13. After the interview the candidates will be arranged by the Commission in order of merit as disclosed by the aggregate marks finally awarded to each candidate in the Main Examination (written Examination and the Interview put together) and in that order the candidates who are found to be qualified by the Commission at the Examination shall be recommended for appointment upto such number as may be decided by the Commission keeping in view the number of vacancies.
- Provided that the candidates belonging to APST shall be recommended in accordance with provision of Government order No.OM-12/2000 dated 10th October, 2000.
14. The Commission shall publish the results and communicate the marks obtained by the candidate individually.
15. Due consideration shall be made, at the time of making appointment based on the result of the examination and the preference expressed by the candidate for various services at the time of his/her application. The appointment to various services will also be governed by the Rules/Regulation for the time being in force as applicable to the respective services at the time of appointment.
16. Success in the examination confers no right to an appointment of candidate unless Government is satisfied after such enquiry/verification as may be considered necessary, that the candidate having regard to his character and antecedents is suitable in all respects for appointment to the service.
17. A candidate must be in good mental and bodily health and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the discharge of his/her duties as an officer of the services. The medical examination and the certificate thereof shall be as prescribed by Government in their respective service Rules or Government order. Particulars and the nature of the medical test are given in the Appendix-I to these rules.
18. **Repeal and Saving :**
- (1) The Corresponding rules in the respective service Rules relating to the services and post mentioned in Schedule-I to the extent of inconsistency with these Rules, shall stand repealed.
- (2) Notwithstanding such repeal, any appointment made, any order issued, or any action taken under the rules so repealed shall be deemed to have been validly made, issued or taken under the corresponding provision of these rules.

19. **Power of Governor to Amend** : Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules; the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh shall have the right to amend or effect any change in these rules at any time as and when considered necessary.
20. **Power to remove difficulties** : If any difficulty arises in the application of these rules, the Governor may issue appropriate orders, as deemed necessary, for removing such difficulty.
21. **Interpretation** : If any question arises as to the interpretation of these rules, it shall be decided by the Governor whose decision shall be final and binding.

SCHEDULE -II
SECTION -I
PLAN OF EXAMINATION

1. The Combined Competitive Examination shall comprise of two successive stages.
 - (i) Preliminary Examination (Objective Type) for the selection of candidates for the Main Examination; and
 - (ii) The Main Examination (written and Interview) for the selection of candidates for various services and posts.
2. The preliminary Examination will consist of 2 papers of objective type (Multiple choice questions) and carry maximum marks in the subject as set out in Section-II, Part-A of this Schedule. This examination is meant to serve as a screening test only, the marks obtained in the Preliminary Examination by the candidates who are declared qualified for admission to the Main Examination will not be counted for determining their final order of Merit. The number of candidates to be admitted to the Main Examination will be about 12 times the number of vacancies to be filled in the year in the various services and posts. Only those candidates who are declared by the Commission to have qualified in the Preliminary Examination will be eligible for admission to the Main Examination of that particular year, provided they are, otherwise, eligible for admission to the Main Examination.
3. The Main Examination will consist of Written Examination and Interview test. The written examination will consist of 8 (eight) papers of conventional essay type in the subject set out in Section-II, Part-B of this Schedule.
4. Candidates who obtain such minimum qualifying marks in the written part of the Main Examination as may be fixed by the Commission at their discretion, shall be called for an interview for a personality Test (vide Part 'C' of section-II). The number of candidates to be called for Interview will be at a ratio of 1:3 as prescribed under the OM No. 54/2006 dated 7th January, 2008. The interview will carry **275 marks**, (with no minimum qualifying marks).

Marks thus obtained by the candidates in the Main Examination (Written part as well as interview) would determine their final ranking. Candidates will be allotted to the various services keeping in view their ranks in the examination and the option exercised by them for various services and posts.

SECTION - II

Scheme and subject for the Preliminary and the Main Examination

PART - A

- (a) **PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION** : The Preliminary Examination will consist of two objective type papers :
- Paper – I General Studies : - 200 marks, Time 2 hours (Marks scored in this paper will be counted for Qualifying for the mains exams.)
- Paper – II Aptitude Test (CSAT)-200 Marks, Time 2 hours (This paper will be of qualifying Nature). Candidates must score at least 33% in this paper. However, marks scored in this paper shall not be counted for Qualifying for the mains exams.
- (b) Each paper will be of two hours duration. But blind candidates and candidates with Locomotor Disability and Cerebral Palsy where dominant (writing) extremity is affected to the extent of slowing the performance of function (minimum of 40% impairment) will be allowed an extra time of 20 minutes per hour for each paper.
- (c) The question papers will be set in English. The standards of each subject are those of the Degree level course of Indian Universities.
- (d) It is mandatory for the candidate to appear in both the papers of Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Combined Competitive Examination (APPSCCE) (Preliminary Examination) for the purpose of evaluation. Therefore, a candidate will be disqualified, in case he/she does not appear in both the papers of APPSCCE Preliminary Examination.
- (e) Penalty for wrong answers : Candidates should not that there will be penalty (negative marking) for wrong answers marked by a candidate in the Objective Type question papers.

- (c) Each Subject will have 2 papers having 250 marks each for three hours duration.
 (d) The standard of the subjects are those of degree level course of the Indian Universities.

General Instructions : (Preliminary as well as Main Examination) :

- (i) Candidates must write the papers in their own hand. In no circumstances will they be allowed the help of a scribe to write the answers for them. The Persons with Benchmark Disabilities in the categories of blindness, locomotor disability (both arm affected – BA) and cerebral palsy will be provided the facility of scribe, if desired by the person. In case of other category of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities as defined under section 2 (r) of the RPWD Act, 2016, the facility of scribe will be allowed to such candidates on production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation to write, and scribe is essential to write examination on behalf, from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care institution. Such candidates have discretion of opting for his/her own scribe or request the Commission for the same. The details of scribe i.e., whether own or the Commission's and the details of scribe in case candidates are bringing their own scribe, will be sought at the time of filling up the application form online. The qualification of the Commission's scribe as well as own scribe will not be more than the minimum qualification criteria of the examination. However, the qualification of the scribe should always be matriculate or above.
- (ii) The Persons with Benchmarks Disabilities in the category of blindness, locomotor disability (both arm affected-BA) and cerebral palsy will be allowed Compensatory Time of twenty minutes per hour of the examination. In case of other categories of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities, this facility will be provided on production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitation to write from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care institution.
- (iii) Credit will be given for orderly, effective and exact expression combined with due economy of words in all subject of the Examination.
- (iv) In the question papers, whenever necessary question involving the metric system of weights and measure only will be set.
- (v) Marks will not be allotted for mere superficial knowledge.

NB:- The syllabus for Preliminary and Mains examination shall be in accordance to the UPSC pattern of Civil Services Examination, as amended from time to time and shall be notified by the government in consultation with the Arunachal Pradesh Public Service Commission (APPSC). The syllabus shall be published along with advertisement to the posts.

PART-C

INTERVIEW TEST:

- (a) The Candidates will be interviewed by a Board who will have before them a record of his career. He will be asked questions on matters of general interest.
- (b) Interview test will carry 275 marks.
- (c) The objective of the interview is to assess the personal suitability of the candidate for a career in public service by a board of competent and unbiased officers. The test is intended to judge the mental caliber of a candidate. In broad terms this is really an assessment of not only his intellectual qualities but also social traits and his interest in current affairs. Some of the qualities to be judged are mental alertness, critical powers of assimilation, clear and logical exposition, balance of judgment, variety and depth of interest, ability for social cohesion and leadership, intellectual and moral integrity. It will be in the nature of purposive conversation to see that the candidates have intelligent and interest not only in their special academic studies but also in the events which are happening around them both inside and outside their own State or Country as well as in modern currents of thought and discoveries.

APPENDIX – I

(of Govt. Notification No. PERS-24/2018 dated 19th November 2019)

**REGULATION FOR THE MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR APPOINTMENT TO
 VARIOUS CATEGORIES THROUGH
 ARUNACHAL PRADESH PUBLIC SERVICE COMBINED COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION**

1. To be passed as fit for appointment under Government, a candidate must be in good mental and bodily health and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of the duties of his appointment.

2. In the matter of correlation of age, height and chest girt of candidates it is left to the Medical Board to use whatever correlation figure are considered most suitable as a guide in the examination of the candidates.
3. The candidate's height will be measured as follows: He will remove his shoes and be placed against the standard with his feet together and the weight thrown on the heels and not on the toes or outer side, or calves, buttocks and shoulder touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vertex of the head level under the horizontal bar and the height be recorded inches and parts of an inch up to quarters. No, limit of height is however, enforced.
4. Candidates chest will be measured as follows: He will be made to stand erect with his feet together to raise his arms, over his head the tap will be so adjusted round the chest that its upper edge touch the inferior angles of the shoulder blades behind and its lower edge the upper parts of the apples in front. The arms will then be lowered to hang closely by the side, and care will taken that the shoulder are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then take a deep breath several times and the maximum expansion of the chest will be carefully noted.

The minimum and the maximum will then be recorded in inches; for e.g. 33-35, 34-36, ½ etc.

In recording the measurements fractions of less than inch should not be noted.

5. Notwithstanding the regulation provided at para 3 and 4 above, candidates applying for the Arunachal Pradesh Police Service (APPS) has to conform to the physical standard prescribed in Appendix-II.
6. The candidates will also be weighed, and his weight recorded in Kg. fractions of Kg(s) should not be noted.
7. - (c) Squint or any morbid condition of the eyes or of the lids or of the either eye liable to risk of aggravation on recurrence, will cause the rejection of the candidates.

- (e) Inability to distinguish the principle colours will not be regarded as a cause for rejection, but the fact will be noted in the proceedings and the candidate will be informed.
