

General English: Questions in this section will be designed to test fundamental language skills, Grammar rules, vocabulary skills, reading and comprehension.

General Studies: Questions in this section will aim at testing the candidate's general awareness of the surrounding environment and its implication to the society as expected from an educated person without any specialized study. It will include current affairs, recent developments, day to day pragmatic observations and matters of importance. This section will also include questions pertaining to general awareness related to International, National and North-East India.

- Teaching, Maxims of teaching
- Learning, Learning objectives and outcomes
- Teaching & Instruction, Events of instruction
- Factors Affecting Teaching
- Teaching techniques, teaching style, classroom management
- Ethics in teaching

Pedagogy:

- Understanding the Learner - growth, maturation and development, Domains of Development: Physical, Cognitive, Socio-emotional, Moral etc., deviations in development and its implications, Understanding Adolescent behaviour.
- Understanding Teaching Learning - Principles of Learning, Theories - Behaviourism, Cognitivism and Constructivism, Role of teacher, role of learner. Nature of teacher-student relationship, Factors affecting learning.
- Teaching strategies & methods, Active learning, Classroom environment, Classroom Communication, Skill components in Teaching.
- Planning instruction – session plan, lesson plan.
- Curriculum & Syllabus, Outcome based curriculum.
- NEP 2020 – implications for school.
- ICT in teaching-learning, Instructional resource.

Section – B
GRAMMAR AND USAGE

Ability to apply the knowledge of English grammar and use the same properly in the context
